Joost Vos' experience with extraordinary projects such as the Anne Frank House, Stedelijk Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art, station Amsterdam Centraal and the North/South metro line in Amsterdam, enables him to approach complex processes in a very elementary way. One of his completed projects is a university faculty of law, the Grotius building on the campus of the Radboud University in Nijmegen, which has been said to be a "refined pavilion in the park." Data center for Equinix - AM4, next to AM3 (2012) - on Science Park Amsterdam, has been called "A Temple of the 21st Century" by Dutch newspaper De Volkskrant. In 2021, Museum Arnhem will be restored to its former glory (1873), and a new impressive cantilevered extension will open.

Joost Vos is a member of the Royal Institute of Dutch Architects (bna).

Joost Vos has given public lectures and has been a jury member for international awards in the Netherlands and abroad, including Amsterdam, Rotterdam, Delft, Nijmegen, Arnhem, Eindhoven, Brussels (Belgium), Dublin (Ireland), New Delhi (India), Chicago (US), Weimar, Dessau/Bauhaus and Düsseldorf (Germany), Seoul (South Korea), Nancy (France), Milan (Italy).
